3.	Some people oppose Federal Government measures to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, saying that Canada's contribution is insignificant compared of that of China or the US. Do you agree or disagree? Support your answer, demonstrating your knowledge of Global Climate Change. [whether you agree will not affect your mark]	20	
4.	A Canadian city wants to increase the tree cover in its residential areas and has asked consultants to prepare a feasibility report. What are the advantages of an increased forest cover? What are the disadvantages? [hint: there are many advantages as well as disadvantages]	20	
5.	A logging company wants to harvest timber in a watershed containing numerous small streams that feed into a larger stream that is well-known for its steelhead trout population, which is popular with recreational fishermen taking advantage of the strictly enforced catch-and-release fishery. The Provincial Ministry responsible for forest practices has prepared detailed regulations that limit the amount of timber harvest and at the same time increases the costs of logging in the watershed. The company states that the value of the timber is far greater than the value of the few fish in the area they want to log (and in strictly dollar terms they are correct). Discuss the merits of their argument. [hint: this question is about values not forest practices]	20
