6.	Discuss how railways, street cars and automobiles have influenced the building of Canadian cities.	10	
7.	You have just taken a position in the planning department of a fairly large city. They have requested you totally rewrite their Official Community Plan. Explain the purpose of this document & detail the key points that should be addressed.	10	
8.	Explain how demographic trends (as derived from census data) are incorporated into urban planning.	10	
9.	You have just got a job to design a totally new community located in the far north of Saskatchewan where the average winter temperature is -20C. What factors would you need to consider that you may not have considered in your previous planning job in southern Florida?	10	
10.	Traffic calming consists of physical design and other measures that are put in place on roads with the intention of slowing down or reducing motor-vehicle traffic. This is often done as a means to improve safety for pedestrians and cyclists. Explain some of the various methods and how you might apply these to a residential area just outside Regina.
